An Invitation for Conversation

Grace and Peace to you, from God our Creator and from our Redeemer, Jesus the Christ.

This month I am inviting you all to join me for an evening of information and conversation about the role our faith plays in our political lives. Now, I know that, for a long time, it has been taboo to speak those two words in the same sentence, but the reality is that we cant', nor should we, separate what our faith tells us about how we treat others and our civic responsibility. As followers of Christ, we commit to "love our neighbor as ourselves" and follow the example of Jesus in caring for the poor, the marginalized, the hurting and the hungry. We commit to seeing others as Beloved of God in Christ, and to acting with compassion and love toward those we disagree with. So, the question becomes, how do we live out those commitments in a world that is increasingly politically divided, with every side claiming that God supports only them?

These questions are uncomfortable, our faith and our politics involve deeply held beliefs and strong emotions; and most of us would rather not talk about them than risk confrontation and disagreement. However, we are in a time when the public conversations that are happening are increasingly uncivil and there are political parties using the name of Jesus to support actions that directly harm the poor and the marginalized. In short, this conversation is one that we, as people of faith, need to have.

Which brings me to the invitation. You are invited to join me on Thursday, August 17th in attending a forum sponsored by the Ottawa Unifying Coalition*. The theme of the forum is "Faith and Politics in Ottawa County," and will take place from 6-7:30 p.m. at Central Park Place in Grand Haven. Afterward we will gather for refreshment (place TBA) and conversation on what we heard and what we learned. I believe that part of our work as Christians is to continue learning, growing and wrestling with difficult issues and difficult conversations with love and respect for each other.

I look forward to seeing you on the 17th, God guide us in our learning and in our wrestling with difficult but important issues, amen.
