

Good Shepherd Lutheran Church in Holland is a fairly new church beginning in 1994 with 13 people. Our building was dedicated in 2009 and our "Tapestry" women's group joined WELCA in 2015. We were growing, with Sunday attendance reaching 80, and planning several Tapestry events every year: luncheons with crafts, Bible Study, exercises, guest speakers. Call it burnout, declining interest in church attendance, blame covid, whatever the 'excuse' we struggle for volunteers, ideas, event planners.

Fast forward, 2023, Sunday attendance is down to 30, and Tapestry, too, is struggling. Two past chairwomen of Tapestry decided it was time to give it a try and plan something. We wanted it to be simple, not too long (3 hours), fun, and free to attend (we did have a potluck lunch). On June 10, "Let the SONshine In" began with a Bible Study on the first part of John 1. We talked about how we pictured God creating light in the beginning and about how the rising sun is such a powerful image of light in darkness. We also discussed how we are called to reflect and shine God's light into the world. This was a wonderful lead up to our sun catcher craft. A non church member friend who makes jewelry and sun catchers as a hobby introduced and assisted as each of us made a sun catcher to take home. We had purchased the supplies so that everyone could choose colors and charms to add making their own unique creation. We then had our potluck salad and dessert luncheon and time to visit. We didn't have our past attendance but we did have 12 ladies who experienced a wonderful, sunny, day of fellowship and faith.

We took a free will "thank offering" which we agreed to match from our Tapestry funds to send to our Mitten WELCA. We had not contributed in a while and that felt good too. I am so glad we tried and planned the event.

# **IS THE CLIMATE CHANGING?**

In 1955 torrential rains caused by Hurricane Diane resulted in severe flooding in the northeastern U.S., claiming some 200 lives. There are a lot of weather-caused disasters today. So is there really a human caused Climate Change effecting us now in 2023?

In a recent survey titled "Global Warming's Six Americas". The six categories of people's thoughts that people had about Climate Change were:

ALARMED	Convinced global warming is a serious and immediate threat but many still
	don't know what to do about it.
CONCERNED	Accept the science and support climate policies, but see the threat as more
	distant.
CAUTIOUS	Still need to be convinced that the problem is real, serious, and urgent.
DISENGAGED	People who know little and care less.
DOUBTFUL	Don't consider climate change a serious risk or consider it much at all.
DISMISSIVE	Rejecting of the idea that human-caused climate change is a threat.

#### Can You Place Yourself in One of These Categories?

The survey found that

26% of the people surveyed were in the ALARMED category,
28% were in the CONCERNED category,
20% were in the CAUTIOUS category,
7% were in the DISENGAGED category,
11% were in the DOUBTFUL category, and
7% in the DISMISSIVE category.

No matter what category you may fall into, you have probably heard a lot in the news about the climate changing. The unbelievable out-of-control wildfires in Canada, a wildfire in Maui destroying an entire city, the polar icecaps are melting at an unbelievable rate, the ocean's levels are rising faster than expect making some islands uninhabitable, and coral reefs are deteriorating from the heat.

Reducing the burning of fossil fuels such as oil, gas, and coal are thought to be the most important thing that can be done to slow Climate Change. To do that, society needs to develop different ways to provide energy to run our economic system. New ways of transportation are going to have to be encouraged and accepted.

This subject needs to be discussed by all of us. Your Stewardship Committee is ready and willing to discuss it with you. Please contact them at any time.

*The Moment of Lift* will fill your heart with hope and ignite your sense of urgency.



#### September/October Noisy Offering: Benjamin's Hope

This story of the beginning of Benjamin's Hope is excerpted from "OUR STORY" on their website (<u>https://www.benjaminshope.net/</u>

"The Benjamin's Hope story began with a realization that every parent of a child with developmental differences has to face: "One day, the school bus is going to stop coming." One day, the structure that helps my child connect, learn, and grow will no longer exist.

Krista Mason and her husband Dave found themselves starting to ponder this reality around the time their son Ben was ten years old. Ben had a diagnosis of autism that included nonverbal communication as his primary form of engaging the world. As Ben grew, the Masons recognized a need for their son and those like him to have a place to thrive as adults."

After years of research, visiting organizations around the nation, meeting with experts in many fields . . .

"Krista launched the "Live, Learn, Play, Worship" model to inspire the creation of Benjamin's Hope. While many organizations like Ben's Hope embrace a "Live, Learn, Play" model of care, Krista also wanted to ensure those with developmental differences seeking a home in the church could experience the full joy of participation in a faith community without judgement, isolation or a curriculum that removes them from the larger community.

Today, Benjamin's Hope serves as a debt-free 501(c)3 organization that not only offers a thriving neighborhood cherished as home by 30 adults with developmental differences, but also a community for Christ followers of all abilities, now 400 members strong. In addition, the 52 acres of Ben's Hope serve as a central gathering for the larger community--all to help ensure individuals of every ability can live, learn, play and worship in the ways that fit them best."
