

What is the JOY OF GIVING?

In one of our meetings Pastor suggested we have people express the JOY OF GIVING either verbally or in writing to share with the congregation. My first thoughts were "who is joyful about giving? Most of us are very conscience about "getting" enough money and time just to raise a family and pay the bills. Giving is way down the list of things we want to do." Once you realize you have enough, however, then it is hard to change directions and start giving of yourself and your possessions.

May we all feel the JOY OF GIVING through our membership in Good Shepherd Lutheran Church.



Breeze Access

Breeze is the church management software system that we use to maintain records for Good Shepherd.

If you are a member or a regular attender you may have access to sections of Breeze. Within Breeze you could access other Good Shepherd people to locate their address, phone number or email address should you wish to contact them.

You also have access to online giving, to set up recurring giving, manage your giving weekly or monthly, or check your own giving record.
