The Lord of Wind and Flame

Grace and Peace to you in the name of the Triune God in whom we live and breathe and have our being!

Happy early Pentecost!

That's right, it's June and on Sunday the 8th we celebrate what is often called the "Birthday of the Church", Pentecost. Pentecost, Greek word for fifty, marks the end of the Easter season and comes fifty days after Easter. Pentecost also refers to the Jewish festival of weeks, which celebrates the giving of the Torah to the people of Israel.

The story of Pentecost is found in Acts 2:1-21. The apostles are gathered in one place to celebrate Pentecost, and in a rush of "violent wind," the Holy Spirit shows up, igniting tongues of flame which rested on each apostle, filling them with the Holy Spirit and giving them the ability to speak in "other languages." This commotion soon draws a crowd of people, "devout Jews from every nation under heaven", who then hear the Disciples proclaiming the good news of Jesus in their native languages.

In other words, the Holy Spirit showed up in wind and flame and bridged and broke down a barrier so that every person there could experience the good news *for them* in their language; God meeting God's beloved where they are at, in exactly the way they needed to be met.

We celebrate this as the beginning of "the Church" because it was the first time that the gospel was proclaimed, by the apostles, to people who were of other nationalities. It represented the expansion of the message. Soon, this same message would be proclaimed outside of the Jewish faith altogether; Gentiles would be accepted into the fold and included as the body of Christ. From this point onward, the gospel is proclaimed and accepted in ever-widening circles, breaking down barriers of race, religion, status, wealth, and gender. Women, children, and Intersex people (Acts 8: 26-40) are included as believers and apostles.

From the very beginning of the Church, the God of wind and flame has moved us through the Holy Spirit to break down barriers and to proclaim that God's grace is for everyone, and two-thousand years later our work is still not done. Today, God's word is proclaimed in every language in the world, and yet there are still people who have not heard that God's grace is for them. This is not because of language, it is because of the lines we, the Church, have drawn between who is in and who is out.

The Church has drawn lines around gender, gender identity, sexual orientation, age, race, and wealth. Every boundary the world has put up, and every group of people the world has deemed to be outcast or unwelcome, the Church has also marginalized. People of color, Continued next page

those who identify as female, children, indigenous people, elderly people, people experiencing poverty or homelessness, our LGBTQ+ siblings, people struggling with mental illness, chronic illness, disability...all have experienced the church at one time or another, as a place where they have been specifically told that God's grace is not for them. They have experienced the church as an institution that does not see or accept them and uses the Bible to tell them they do not belong.

It seems that we have strayed away from the first days of wind and flame.

Thankfully, the Lord of wind and flame has not abandoned us. Two thousand years ago, God sent the Holy Spirit upon the disciples in wind and flame, sending them out beyond barriers to proclaim that God is for us. God, in Christ Jesus, also sent the Holy Spirit as an Advocate, and a source of the peace that passes all understanding (John 14: 8-17, 25-27). God calls us to wildly include others, to go beyond our comfort zone, to break down barriers and proclaim a love through Christ that is almost reckless in its inclusion. God also gave us the Holy Spirit to let us know we are not alone, to wrap around us in love when we are scared, when the prospect of change leaves us anxious, when we feel like we can't take a step into the unknown.

This Pentecost, in addition to wearing red and singing songs to the Holy Spirit, let us also invite her into our everyday life. Trusting that God is with us and holding that peace that passes understanding within our being, let us be open to wind and flame.

May we dream dreams of how our community of faith can be a place of love, honesty, hope and transformation in the lives of the people we live among, may we, with holy imagination, envision what God might be calling us to, and may we completely trust that God is indeed with us as we strive to live as the body of Christ in the world. Amen.


